PROPOSED ORDER

Respondent has moved the Court to amend its Order to permit the contingent auction of certain computer storage equipment covered by the Court's March 6, 1998, order pursuant to the following terms:

Sales of electronic storage devices, including notebook computers, CPUs, and servers, as well as any other computer processor or storage device, are contingent upon final confirmation by the United States District Court for the District of Columbia. In the event that any such sale is not confirmed, the contingent seller's sole obligation is to provide a full refund of the auction price of the item not delivered. Delivery will take place within 30 days of sale; however, delivery of certain items may be able to commence in as soon as 2 weeks.
