THE DEPUTY CLERK: U.S. ex rel Ervin versus Hamilton Securities, Civil Action 96-1258. Tony Alexis representing the plaintiff. Daniel Hawke representing the defendant.

Ms. Heatherton from HUD is, along with Dan Van Horn, and it's like pulling teeth, even with the special masters, in helping to try to get all the documents, and my understanding is they don't even have the documents to even begin the review. So HUD hasn't even begun the review of the documents.

One of my concerns also --

MS. HEATHERTON: That's not exactly --

MR. ALEXIS: Well, we do have some of it. We do have some of the documents.

MS. HEATHERTON: Yes. We haven't gotten access to

the electronic records yet. 1 MR. ALEXIS: We don't have the electronic records. 2 THE COURT: Is that because -- is the master having 3 trouble getting them? 4 MS. HEATHERTON: No, it has to do with working it 5 out. 6 THE COURT: Are they helpful to you? 7 MS. HEATHERTON: Are the special masters? Yes. 8 THE COURT: That's working out pretty well? 9 MS. HEATHERTON: Yes. 10 MR. ALEXIS: Another issue, we are at a critical 11 phase in terms of actually interviewing people. I don't want 12 to have the government's infomatter on this matter at this 13 particular time, because one of the defendants, Goldman Sachs, 14 is about to go public. You know, the last thing we want to do 15 is have some kind of negative impact on the stock. 16 Under these circumstances we haven't had a chance to 17 fully review, and before we finish our investigation, we would 18 like that extra time. We are conducting the actual interviews 19 of some of the key defendants. 20 THE COURT: So you need some more time. Is that all 21 22 right with you? 23 MR. HAWKE: Yes, we consent. THE COURT: So when do you want to come back, 24

November?

MR. ALEXIS: Yes, I'd ask for I believe, Your Honor, 1 until November 13. 2 THE COURT: If you need any more help from the 3 special master, I could -- are they giving you all the cooperation that you need? Because that's the charge to them. 5 MS. HEATHERTON: Yes. 6 THE COURT: And they're pretty good people. 7 no bunch -- they're pretty smart people. They know what 8 they're doing. And I would think they would know this area 9 pretty well. 10 MR. ALEXIS: My understanding is it's not the 11 special master. It's getting things to the -- the special 12 master is in control of the documents is the way I see it. 13 MS. HEATHERTON: Well, it's a question of agreement 14 as to how these things are going to be turned over and whether 15 they're going to be turned over to us and who is going to do 16 the reviewing and that sort of thing. 17 THE COURT: Well, there shouldn't be any reason why 18 you shouldn't get access to them, right? 19 MS. HEATHERTON: Well, --20 THE COURT: Who is opposing it? 21 MS. HEATHERTON: We've been through many counsel on 22 either side, Your Honor, so we have --23 THE COURT: Well, come on back to the court if there 24

is a problem.

1	MS. HEATHERTON: Yes, we will.
2	THE COURT: I mean, there shouldn't be any problem.
3	We got to really move this thing in fairness to everybody.
4	THE DEPUTY CLERK: A status in November, Judge?
5	THE COURT: Yes.
6	THE DEPUTY CLERK: November 16 at 10:30?
7	MR. ALEXIS: That's fine. Thank you, Your Honor.
8	THE COURT: And as I say, again, the special master
9	is there to help. He's not going to be to hinder anybody.
